

Applying for student finance

New students from England

How to apply:

Most full-time students from England can apply online to Student Finance England by following the below steps.

Step 1: Click on the following link to apply:

<https://www.gov.uk/student-finance-register-login>

Step 2: Click on the 'Start Now' button

Step 3: Click on 'Create an account' and complete the online application process.

- It is important to note that in order to complete your online application you will need to know your National Insurance number.

Step 4: Take your time to complete your application. Read each step throughouly to ensure that you complete your application correctly the first time. By taking your time to apply for student finance carefully, you will reduce the risk of receiving late tuition fee and maintenance payments.

Step 5: Usually, within 6 weeks of applying you will get a **loan declaration** in the post. Make sure to sign and return this to Student Finance England as soon as possible.

Important information for completing your application:

Proof of identity

Student Finance states that students from England will need to:

Include your valid UK passport details in your application the first time you apply. Do not send the passport itself.

If you do not have a UK passport (or it has expired), send your original birth or adoption certificate using the certificate form. You can find the required forms by clicking on the following link:

Household Income

Student Finance states that students from England must provide household income if you apply for any of the following:

- Full Maintenance Loan
- Maintenance Grant - not available if your course started on or after 1 August 2016
- Special Support Grant - not available if your course started on or after 1 August 2016
- Childcare Grant
- Adult Dependants' Grant
- Parents' Learning Allowance

You'll need to provide your household income for tax year:

- 2016 to 2017 if you're applying for the 2018 to 2019 academic year

After you apply, Student Finance England will ask the people in your household to confirm their income. They might need to provide evidence.

What counts as household income

Your household income is your **taxable income** plus the income of:

- Your parents - if you're under 25 and live with them or depend on them financially
- One of your parents and their partner - if you're under 25 and live with them or depend on them financially
- Your partner - if you're over 25 and live with them (even if they spend most of their time abroad)

Full course length (years): refer to CRIC offer letter

Year of course in 2018/19: refer to CRIC offer letter

Full tuition fee amount for the academic year 2018/19: refer to CRIC offer letter

If the course is franchised to another university or college, give their address below: leave blank

C) Course type (please tick one box)

Tick 'Full-time undergraduate'

D) Term details

Tick 'University or College' for all three terms.

Continuing students from England

How to reapply as a continuing student:

You are classed as a 'continuing student' if you received finance last year. In order to reapply for the 2018/2019 academic year you will need to **login to your student finance account** and **reapply online**.

When to apply:

Apply now for the 2018 to 2019 academic year. By applying now you will receive your maintenance and tuition fee loan and Books Plus at the beginning of the 2018/19 academic year and avoid delays. **Applications can take months to be processed and completed.**

Important Information:

- As soon as you receive your Student Finance Entitlement letter, detailing the breakdown of payments to the university, bring this into the CRIC office.
- Most of your correspondence with Student Finance England will be through your online account. Whilst you will be sent hard copies of documents to your home address, all of these documents will also be sent to your online account. Therefore it is of vital importance to remember your **Customer Reference Number and login details** that you are given when you begin your application.
- When you need to call Student Finance England, they will always ask you for your **Customer Reference Number, Password and Secret Answer**. It is necessary to have these pieces of information available to you at all times when dealing with Student Finance.
